VENUE ACCESSIBILITY

Entrance to the James Hay Theatre is from the main foyer of the Town Hall. There are stairs to the left of the main entrance and a lift further down the foyer to the right.




PEGGY GRAM - VISUAL COMMUNICATION JUDGE
