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

Sweet Adelines Intl Region 35 NZ Statement of Accounting Policies

For the year ended 31 December 2021

Basis of Preparation

Sweet Adelines Intl Region 35 NZ is required by constitution to prepare financial statements.

The Entity is eligible to apply Tier 3 on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has a total annual expense equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting.

The Financial Statements have been prepared for Region members.

The Financial Statements have been prepared on the Historic Cost basis and presented in New Zealand dollars (NZD) rounded to the nearest dollar.

The Accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to both periods presented in these financial statements.

All amounts are recorded exclusive of GST, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis, with the exception of accounts receivable and accounts payable (which are shown as GST inclusive amounts).

Income Tax

Sweet Adelines Intl Region 35 NZ is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 180 days or less.
