You just can't help but smile when you see the faces of singers from other areas of the country who have come to join in the same event and their sense of anticipation of the fun ahead is as high as your own.

The STAR Chorus is a fantastic opportunity for singers who are not competing but who still value a chance to perform. A perfect



way to connect with members from around the Region!

Friday we began the day with Music in the Morning, and watching from the side-lines it was heart-warming to observe the audience connect with Carolyn, Shelley and TeeJay as they took the participants through the vocal and physical warm-ups of the day. Sarah Rae was scheduled to be presenting at this class but was not able to attend; we missed you on the stage, Sarah, but look forward to you joining us in Dunedin next year.

The afternoon rolled in, and we were entertained by the quartet contest. I had the pleasure of working the traffic pattern for this contest so missed the performances, but I am assured by both audience feedback, and the contestants scores, that it was an impressive contest. The loud audience support of the quartets was audible when the doors opened to the auditorium, demonstrating to me in the foyer the connection these groups were making with their peers, family and friends in that audience.

As I juggled the quartets arriving into the traffic pattern from one room to another I re-connected with many singers I haven't seen for some time. It's like greeting family members you only see at reunions or weddings. But no time for chit chat these singers were there for a purpose. Presenting quartet awards at the end of the session along with the Membership Awards was an absolute bonus! We had so

The Spirit Award is a very highly anticipated award and this year's most deserving winner is Mary Ann Zorovic. Unfortunately, Mary Ann was unable to be at convention to accept her award but I know Greater Auckland Chorus will celebrate this outstanding recognition with Mary Ann.

This year we introduced 2 further membership awards and these along with our longevity, merit and other awards were presented at the conclusion of the quartet session – In this edition you will find articles on these awards. It's always so heartening to see our members recognised for their time and efforts within our organisation.

Friday evening saw further rehearsals being held and music ringing out as you walked around the venue. Saturday the venue was truly humming with sound, the sound of 200 members of the public arriving to support a chorus, the sound of people connecting as they caught sight of someone they knew heading into the traffic pattern. The sound of conversations between singers as to who had the extra lipstick or who had the extra bronzer and other very important details! Then the chorus contest was underway and that full, beautiful sound of four-part harmony as sung by choruses both large and small, took flight. Fantastic. As more of our 388 registrants began to fill the auditorium having had their moment on the stage the excitement and camaraderie in the room was a delight to behold. Connections were made as those seated congratulated those who entered having just sung. Much appreciation for each performance was shared, hearty congratulations given to many, comments made on ballads that moved the listener or uptunes that had the listener toe tapping all the way, and so on it went.



The awards session for choruses was a very interesting time backstage. The acoustics were such that we in the wings could not understand a word that was being said on stage so as our Panel Chair, Vickie Maybury, made her announcements we were relying on a basis of charades from those with an ear pressed to the curtain to convey which award was needed! We got there in the end with much laughter and not a little frustration at that situation. The winners were duly acknowledged with medals, trophies, certificates and more. But the day as we know is about so much more than the awards -

it was the fun, the singing, the support shown for one another and for those who took the stage, knowing that you achieved so much by being on that stage.

We Sweet Adelines know what it takes to have those few precious moments on the competition stage.

After all the fun of the day the crowd duly left and attended parties or dinners or both. I understand that the singing carried on for many hours at the party hosted by Christchurch City Chorus, which included the reconnecting of the quartet Perfect Timing to entertain the diners.

Sunday, our last day of being together as a Region began with a breakfast that the RMT hosted for Team Coordinators and Directors. This was an event that was held for many years some time ago in our Region and this year seemed most appropriate to hold this breakfast once again to congratulate these leaders on all they have done to keep this Region active over the past few extraordinary years. I trust there were people other than me, who connected across the breakfast tables and swapped stories and anecdotes or wishes for contests of the future.

Onwards to the Education Classes – we are very lucky in our Region that the Official Panel are usually available the day after contest and willing to take classes for the membership. This year all four judges took two classes each and from the level of conversation during the class changeover I am sure there are now many members who have a new level of knowledge in several areas of our art form.

It was sad to say goodbye at the close of classes. We had formed such a bond with fellow singers over the 3 short days we'd been together. We had exchanged numbers or social media connections with new friends, we had shared stage experiences and dinner and party escapades with old and new acquaintances. And then it was over.

Thank you to everyone involved in putting together Voices at Victory! We had volunteers from across the country involved in this convention and we are very grateful for all you did to enable us to reconnect after three years of no contest.

We hold tight to the knowledge that next year we will connect again as we now begin to rehearse for those few short minutes on stage! Roll on Dunedin 2024.

**Congratulations to Bernadette Takacs - Sweet Adelines New** Zealand Service to Young Women in Harmony Award recipient for 2023!

Bernadette was nominated by her chorus Welington City Chorus who say:

Bernadette comes from a family which can only be described as "singers on steroids". Along with this backdrop, this woman has a rich history of singing not only barbershop, but also her participation in church choirs, solo singing at weddings, funerals and other events. She has been involved in musical theatre and jazz bands, and has brought a unique set of skills and experience to our Sweet Adelines family.

But it's what she does for young women that really makes her shine. When her own children were attending her old school, she coached the school choir. Soon after joining Sweet Adelines, she was invited to judge the young women's contests, and she volunteered to coach the girls' chorus at the school soon after that. Over the years there have been several successes - the school has had two second places in the national quartet competition and the Chorus has reached 5th and 3rd in the nationals. There is some very stiff competition both in Wellington and other NZ regions, so these competitors from a little school have managed to regularly punch above their weight.

Anybody who works with young women in that age group will know that it entails a lot more than standing in front of a group and coaching the singing. There are the all the dramas connected with costuming for the quartets, choreography, the story plan, and other associated challenges.

And so it has been for nearly 25 years.

On a totally voluntary basis, she continues to coach barbershop choruses and quartets. This involves weekly coaching at her old school, as well as preparing the chorus and numerous quartets over the years for the regional YWIH contests. Though she is a volunteer, the school treats her like one of the team - even inviting her to present at prize-givings for the Cultural Awards.

It has often occurred to the writer that this woman missed her true calling. While she excels at many things, and may not agree, she is a born teacher. Her energy and enthusiasm, along with her enjoyment of the barbershop craft, shines through in all the groups of young women she has brought to contest-readiness over the years. When asked what her motivation was, she said "I just wanted to help them and help them improve".

Many of our current members have been inspired by our old music teachers, and it is certain that the mahi that this recipient has put in over the years has resulted in young



women being inspired to join our organisation later in life. Indeed, parents of those young women have often thanked this recipient for inspiring their children.

Wellington City Chorus wholeheartedly endorses this nomination for Bernadette Takacs to receive the YWIH Award.
