Team Coordinator – Report

Discussion around convention, 30th Anniversary celebrations and the show continued from the previous night.

A suggestion was made to invite past members to the opening ceremony as a celebration of the past 30 years of Sweet Adelines in New Zealand. This would provide an opportunity to sell more tickets to the competition events and the Saturday night show.

The Saturday night show and opening ceremony were discussed as to which items should be held at which event. It was decided that the Opening Ceremony would be Thursday night and would feature the 30th Anniversary celebrations. The theatre can be used or the foyer as a venue to save the \$1500 - \$2000 to hire an additional room. Would depend on the estimated number of attendees. It was felt that the opening ceremony should retain the same atmosphere as last year but a stage may be needed so that all can see.

Messages from Ann Gooch, Shirley Kout, Marcia Pinvidic and choruses from other regions would be played on screens at the opening ceremony.

Spirit nominees would be announced and their pictures shown on the big screen, and the winner announced.

Opening ceremony attendees would be encouraged to wear an old chorus or quartet costume.

A cash bar would be available for those who wish to mix and mingle after the formalities.

A vote was taken on whether the show should be kept separate from the 30th celebration. 6 people voted for.

The Saturday night show was discussed. Suggested that it feature the competition winners circle, chorus items (choruses to submit a request to perform with an audition video of what they can do – show committee to choose). A special well known guest may be needed to perform or an alternative act so that the show isnt all barbershop. RMT members to think about possible guest artists.

Miriam to send a questionnaire to directors/choruses to gather more detailed information.

The Mass sing part of convention needs to be confirmed. Thought was that it needed to be part of the programme and held in Aotea Square as a good publicity opportunity for SANZ.

Mabel provided an update about why the SA International site map wasn't showing all choruses in New Zealand. Email from International outlined how the site worked and that it was how the rehearsal venue and address was listed on the chorus renewal form.

Membership Coordinator – Report

Spirit Awards – As an action from the previous meeting Julie has been trying to get information from other regions as to what membership awards they give out.

Some ideas that have come through are

- quiet achiever awards
- leadership awards
- women of note
- getting all choruses to nominate and then acknowledging all at their educations

Discussion was had around what the other regions do but it was decided that we don't need more awards in New Zealand. RMT would like to keep the award similar to the current but have choruses submit applications on a questionnaire to a set of criteria. Then all applications will be equal. All nominees to be recognised and then a winner chosen. Choruses also to be given ideas about how other choruses do it. Choose a spirit award as part of their chorus end of year celebrations then that person is put forward for the national award.

Mary Ann provided an update about the number of paid members in the region. So far with 3 choruses yet to come in there are 579 members in New Zealand. Around 70-75 still to come in so membership sitting at around 650. Only 25 youth members. The international numbers have us at 703. Mary Ann to write to choruses with international number and paid members and ask to check and reconcile the difference.

He Tangata Chorus

Communication was received via email from the He Tangata Chorus around their proposed change of name. The members of He Tangata chorus had had a vote on what they would like their name to be. Discussion was had on the proposed name and what say RMT has on the management of the He Tangata Chorus. It was felt that any use of the words New Zealand or National Chorus was confusing as it implies it is a chorus of New Zealand Champions or selected representatives from NZ.

Mabel to go back to He Tangata – Jan Toynbee, Rebecca Chaplow, Robyn Ransom and Virginia Humphrey Taylor and inform them that the RMT does not support the name they have chosen due to the use of the words New Zealand and National.	Mabel
